# AN ACT TO CREATE THE GUAM FILM OFFICE BY ADDING A NEW ARTICLE 4 TO CHAPTER 50 OF DIVISION 2 OF TITLE 12, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED.

17	§50401. Definit	ions.

a) "Administrator" means the administrator of the Guam Film Office, who shall be the Director of the Guam Economic Development Authority or his/her designee.

- b) "Charitable or student films" shall mean commercials, motion pictures, television, videotapes, or still photography produced by a nonprofit organization that is registered with the Department of Revenue and Taxation or the Internal Revenue Service as a charitable organization or is produced by students of an educational institution, and for which no person, directly or indirectly, shall receive a profit from the marketing and production of the film or from showing the films, tapes, or photos.
- c) "Commercial films," shall mean and include all activity attendant to filming any entertainment or advertising programs for any media now known or hereafter created.
- d) "Filming" shall mean and include all activity attendant to staging or shooting commercial motion pictures, television shows or programs, and commercial still photography, video tapes, computer-based programs, or other visual reproduction technology now known or hereafter created. The period of filming includes the set-up, strike and time of photography.
- e) "Government" shall mean the Government of Guam its authorized agents, officers, representatives and employees of departments, agencies, autonomous agencies, offices or instrumentalities.
- f) "News Media" shall mean the photographing, filming or videotaping for the purpose of spontaneous, unplanned television news broadcast or reporting for print media by journalists, reporters,

photographers or camera operators.

- g) "Private Property" shall mean any property not owned by the Government of Guam on which filming would not interfere with public right of way, access or safety.
- h) "Pyrotechnic Device" means any combination of materials, including pyrotechnic compositions, which, by the agency of fire, produce an audible, visual, mechanical or thermal effect designed and intended to be useful for industrial, agricultural, personal safety, or educational purposes. The term "pyrotechnic device" includes, but is not limited to, agricultural and wildlife fireworks, model rockets, exempt fireworks, emergency signaling devices, and special effects.
- i) "Pyrotechnic operator" means any licensed pyrotechnic operator, who by examination, experience, and training, has demonstrated the required skill and ability in the use and discharge of fireworks as authorized by the license granted.
- j) "Studio" shall mean a fixed place of business where filming activities (motion or still photography) are regularly conducted upon the premises.

#### §50402. Guam Film Office.

There is hereby established within the Guam Economic Development Authority a Guam Film Office. The Administrator of the Guam Economic Development Authority shall be responsible for the administration of the Guam Film Office.

## §50403. Rules and Regulations.

a) Rules and Regulations. The Administrator *shall* cause the promulgation of rules, regulations and fees to govern the form, time and location of filming activity set forth within Guam. The rules and

regulations *shall* also provide for the issuance of permits. The rules, regulations, and fees shall be adopted in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Act, Title 5 Guam Code Annotated, Chapter 9, within ninety (90) days upon the enactment of this Article. The rules and regulations shall be based upon the following criteria:

- 1. The health and safety of all persons;
- 2. Avoidance of undue disruption of all persons within the affected area;
- 3. The safety of property in Guam; and
- 4. Traffic congestion at particular locations in Guam

§50404. Guam Film Office Fund. There is established a fund to be known as the Guam Film Office Fund, which *shall* be maintained separate and apart from any other funds of the government of Guam, including the General Fund of the government of Guam. Independent records and accounts *shall* be maintained in connection therewith. Funds of the Guam Film Office Fund shall be used exclusively for the administration and operations of the Guam Film Office. All funds collected from fees, charges or fines levied pursuant to this Chapter *shall* be deposited into the Guam Film Office Fund and all interest earned by the Guam Film Office Fund *shall* accrue. Any unencumbered funds remaining in the Guam Film Office Fund at the end of each fiscal year *shall* remain in that Fund. The Guam Film Office Fund *shall* be subject to audits by the Office of Public Accountability.

### §50405. Permits Required.

a) Permit Required. No person shall use any government street, alley, sidewalk, park, pier, way or other public property owned or

controlled by the Government of Guam for the purpose of making 1 commercial films without first applying for and receiving a permit 2 from the Guam Film Office Administrator or his/her designee, 3 provided that the provisions of this chapter shall not apply to or be 4 construed to affect (1) news media and (2) filming solely for private-5 family use. 6 b) No person shall use any private property for the purpose of 7 making commercial films without first applying for and receiving a 8 permit from the Guam Film Office Administrator or his/her designee. 9 Notwithstanding the foregoing, the provisions of this chapter shall not 10 apply to or be construed to affect the following filming on private 11 12 property: 1. Filming which requires no parking variances and uses no 13 public property or rights of way on public property; 14 2. Filming which does not impair the quiet enjoyment of 15 the surrounding properties; 16 3. Filming which does not involve the use of any 17 pyrotechnic devices; 18 4. A licensed business which regularly employs a licensed 19 pyrotechnic operator; 20 5. Filming by news media; 21 6. Filming solely for private-family use; or 22 7. Filming which does not interfere with the public's use of 23 government property. 24 c) Except as provided herein, each applicant must comply with all 25 local and federal laws and regulations, and must obtain all necessary

permits and licenses as a precondition for the commencement of

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commercial film production hereunder. Thereafter, the permittee shall remain in full compliance with all local and federal laws, regulations, permits and licenses throughout the filming.

d) Upon reasonable notice by the applicant, the Administrator or his/her designee is authorized, upon showing of good cause, to change the conditions under which a permit has been issued, provided that the requirements of this chapter are met and the government of Guam department, agency, autonomous agency, office or instrumentality can undertake all necessary administrative review within the time requested.

**§50406. Exemptions.** The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to or affect:

- A. News Media. Reporters, photographers or cameramen in the employ of a newspaper, news service, or similar entity engaged in the on-the-spot broadcasting of news events concerning those persons, scenes or occurrences which are in the news and of general public interest, including sporting events.
- B. Private/Family Use. The filming or video taping of motion pictures solely for private/family use.
- C. Charitable Films and Student Films. Projects produced by a nonprofit organization that is registered with the Department of Revenue and Taxation or the Internal Revenue Service as a charitable organization or produced by a student(s) of an educational institution.

1	D. Small Crews. If the crew does not exceed five persons
2	and there is no extensive use of props, equipment, cast or
3	other participants, the small crew shall be exempt if:
4	1. Pedestrian and vehicular traffic is not altered.
5	2. The crew is filming a parade, demonstration or
6	other special event. The company must obtain all
7	permission that may be required. The exemption merely
8	allows them to operate on the same basis as a citizen with
9	a camera.
10	3. Camera tripods are used and do not interfere
11	with pedestrian traffic or do not block doors,
12	passageways, etc.
13	4. No special parking provisions are included.
14	5. No stunt work is performed.
15	6. Permission is obtained from controlling
16	authorities to use Government of Guam property, other
17	than sidewalks and streets.
18	7. Permission is obtained from owners to use
19	private property.
20	E. Local Production Companies. For the purposes of this
21	act, companies licensed by the Department of Revenue
22	and Taxation, to do business in Guam, are exempt from
23	paying permit fees if:
24	1. The production company is headquartered in
25	Guam.
26	2. The production company pays taxes in Guam.

1	3. The daily operations of the production company
2	are managed by a resident of Guam.
3	§50407. Applicants and Issuance.
4	a) Issuing Authority. The issuing authority shall be the Guam Film
5	Office Administrator.
6	b) Applications. Each application for filming under this chapter
7	must be completed in full and filed with the Administrator or his/her
8	designee. The following information shall be included in the
9	application:
10	1. The applicant's/organization's name, address
11	and telephone number of place of business;
12	2. A general statement of the nature of the
13	proposed filming activity, including a detailed
14	description of any potentially disruptive activities;
15	3. The inclusive hours and dates such activity will
16	transpire;
17	4. The name of the property owner, and if applicable,
18	business owner, or owner's designee, the address and
19	telephone number of the place at which the activity is to
20	be conducted;
21	5. The specific location at such address or place of each
22	activity scheduled;
23	6. The type of activity scheduled for that day and time;
24	7. The exact number of personnel to be involved;
25	8. The name, address and telephone number of the person
26	or persons in charge of such filming activity;

1	9. A statement regarding the use of animals, pyrotechnics
2	or any other hazardous activity;
3	10. A list of major equipment to be used, including but not
4	limited to trucks, buses, limousines, generators, portable
5	restrooms, and cameras;
6	11. A staging plan illustrating the placement of all sets and
7	props and all equipment, including generators, portable
8	restrooms, and cameras (including booms and cranes);
9	and
10	12. Such additional information as the Administrator or
11	his/her designee may reasonably require.
12	c) The permit application shall be in a form the Administrator or
13	his/her designee may reasonably require. In lieu of the foregoing, the
14	applicant may submit the permit application on the form adopted and in
15	use by the Guam Film Office.
16	d) The Administrator or his/her designee may refer the application
17	to such appropriate government department, agency, autonomous
18	agency, office or instrumentality as are directly impacted by the
19	application and as he/she deems necessary from the nature of the
20	application for review, evaluation, investigation and recommendations
21	by the department, agency, autonomous agency, office or
22	instrumentality regarding approval or disapproval of the application.
23	e) The Administrator or his/her designee shall issue a permit under
24	this chapter if it is determined that the following criteria have been met:
25	1. The proposed use will not unreasonably interfere with
26	traffic or pedestrian movement, or unreasonably
27	interfere with or endanger the public peace or rights of

nearby residents to the quiet, peaceable enjoyment of
their property, or otherwise be detrimental to the public
peace, health, safety or general welfare;

The proposed use will not unduly impede, obstruct or

- 2. The proposed use will not unduly impede, obstruct or interfere with the operation of emergency vehicles or equipment in or through the permit area, or adversely affect the government's ability to perform municipal functions or furnish government services in the vicinity of the permitted area; and
- 3. The proposed use will not constitute a fire or safety hazard and all proper safety precautions will be taken as is reasonably necessary to protect the public peace, health, safety or general welfare.
- f) The Administrator or his/her designee shall deny the permit if the conditions of this chapter and all applicable laws and regulations have not been met or if the application contains incomplete or false information.
- g) The Administrator or his/her designee may immediately revoke or suspend a permit which has been granted, if the conditions of this chapter and all applicable laws and regulations are no longer being met, if the information supplied by the applicant becomes, or is determined to be, false or incomplete, or if any substantial change in circumstances results in the proposed use becoming detrimental to the public peace, health, safety or general welfare.
- h) Reimbursement for Personnel. The production company shall reimburse the Government of Guam for any personnel provided to the company, (i.e. police, fire, traffic control, medical personnel) for the

purpose of assisting the production. Any cost shall be negotiated, and approved, prior to shoot date. A fee for issuance of the permit shall be set by the advisory committee.

## §50408. Indemnification of Government Against Liability.

a) Prior and as a condition precedent to the granting of a permit under this chapter, each applicant shall agree to indemnify, defend and hold the Government of Guam, its authorized agents, officers, representatives and employees harmless form and against any and all losses, damages claims, causes of action, costs, liabilities, penalties, judgments and expenses, including without limitation, defense costs and reasonable legal fees, resulting from any and all claims or damage of any nature, including any accident, loss or damage to persons or property which the government may incur and which arise from or relate to any activity conducted by the permittee or any of its agents, employees, representatives, contractors or consultants in connection with the rights granted in the permit or under this chapter. The form of the indemnification agreement shall be as determined by the Attorney General of Guam.

## §50409. Insurance and Bonding Required.

(a) Liability Insurance. As a condition of issuance of a permit hereunder, every permittee must procure and maintain in full force and effect during the term of the permit a policy (or policies) of insurance from an insurance company licensed to do business in Guam naming the Government of Guam, it's officers, employees and agents as coinsured for protection against claims of third persons for any and all liability of permitteee with respect to its obligations and liabilities under its permit and this chapter and its indemnities, including, but not limited

to, commercial general liability insurance on an "occurrence" basis against claims for personal injury, including death, bodily injury or property damage liability, and in an amount no less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00), and which otherwise provides sufficient coverage that the Administrator or his/her designee determines to be necessary and adequate under the circumstances. The certificate shall not be subject to cancellation or modification until after thirty days' written notice to the Guam Film Office. Prior to issuance of any permit, a copy of the certificate of insurance shall be provided to the Insurance Commissioner. A copy of the certificate will remain on permanent file.

- (b) Worker's Compensation Insurance. An applicant shall conform to all applicable federal and local requirements for worker's compensation insurance for all persons operating under a permit.
- (c) Hold Harmless Agreement. An applicant shall execute a hold harmless agreement as provided by the Government of Guam and incorporated within the permit issued under this chapter.
- (d) Faithful Performance Bond. To ensure cleanup and restoration of any public property involved in the filming, the permittee may be required to post a refundable Faithful Performance Bond (amount to be determined by Rules and Regulations), cash surety or other comparable form of security guarantee at the time application is submitted. Upon completion of filming, cleanup and restoration and a satisfactory inspection of the site by Guam Film Office Administrator or his/her designee, the bond may be returned to applicant.

**§50410. Effective Date.** This Article shall be effective 180 days after the date of enactment.

**§50411. Severability.** *If* any provision of this law or its application to any person or circumstances is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this law, which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or applications, and to this end the provisions of this law are severable."
