The Attorney General of Guam hereby accuses **ANTONIO MANUEL TENORIO CRUZ** of certain crimes committed as follows:

FIRST CHARGE

On or about the 7th day of October 2013, in Guam, **ANTONIO MANUEL TENORIO CRUZ**, did commit the offense of *Fourth Degree Criminal Sexual Conduct*, in that he did intentionally engage in sexual contact with another, to wit: by causing his hand to touch the breast of **J.M.T.C. (DOB: 07-31-1987)**, and used force and coercion to accomplish the sexual contact, in violation of 9 G.C.A. §§ 25.30(a)(1) and (b).


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SECOND CHARGE

On or about the 7th day of October 2013, in Guam, **ANTONIO MANUEL TENORIO CRUZ**, did commit the offense of *Harassment*, in that he did, with intent to harass another, he subjected another, to wit: **J.M.T.C. (DOB: 07-31-1987)**, to offensive touching, in violation of 9 G.C.A. § 61.20(b).

COMES NOW, SEAN BROWN, a duly appointed Assistant Attorney General, and assert, upon information and belief, that the foregoing is true.


I have reviewed Guam Police Report Nos. 13-28624 submitted by GPD Officer D. D. Cepeda which sets forth that the following events occurred on Guam.

On or about October 8, 2013, at about 6:30p.m., police responded to walk in complaint at the Agana Precinct. Police met with J. M. T. C. (d.o.b. July 31, 1987) who explained that she was grabbed on a private area by her uncle on October 7, 2013 at about 7:30p.m.. J. M. T. C. stated to police that she arrived home via the carport and walked toward the house while holding her one year old daughter. J. M. T. C. explained that she saw her uncle, ANTONIO MANUEL CRUZ ("Defendant"), came from a dark area beside the home and approached her. J. M. T. C. stated that she could tell he was drunk by his slurred words and smelled beer on him. J. M. T. C. said that while her hands were occupied with her daughter Defendant grabbed and caressed her right breast with his open palm right hand. J. M. T. C. stated that she was shocked and felt violated.

Based on the forgoing, there is probable cause to charge ANTONIO MANUEL CRUZ with one count of FOURTH DEGREE CRIMINAL SEXUAL CONDUCT (as a Misdemeanor) in violation of Title 9 G.C.A. § 25.30 (a)(1) and (b); and with one count of HARASSMENT (as a Petty Misdemeanor) in violation of Title 9 G.C.A. § 61.20(b).

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.

DECLARATION

COMES NOW, SEAN BROWN, a duly appointed Assistant Attorney General, and assert, upon information and belief, that the foregoing is true.

I have reviewed Guam Police Report No. 13-28650 submitted by GPD Officer C. J. Manlangit which sets forth that the following events occurred on Guam.

On or about October 8, 2013, at about 11:55p.m., police responded to a disturbance in Agat. Police met with Sheila Baza ("Victim") who stated that her brother SONNY BAZA ("Defendant") pushed her earlier in the night. Victim explained that Defendant locked her out of the house using a deadbolt based on an argument they had that morning. Victim contacted their uncle, Edgardo Baza, to help convince Defendant to let her in the home to get items from the house. Defendant eventually allowed her in the home but an argument ensued regarding the keys to the house. Victim threw the keys onto the ground and Defendant responded by pushing the Victim against the wall. Edgardo Baza witnessed Defendant push the Victim and intervened to prevent further incident. Police observed Victim to sustain a swollen contusion to her right forearm with an approximately one inch laceration and minor lacerations on her right middle and right ring finger.

Based on the forgoing, there is probable cause to charge SONNY BAZA with one count of FAMILY VIOLENCE (as a Misdemeanor) in violation of Title 9 G.C.A. §§ 30.10(a)(1) and 30.20(a).



I have reviewed Guam Police Report No. 13-28745 submitted by GPD Officer E. C. Charfauros which sets forth that the following events occurred on Guam.

On or about October 9, 2013, at about 7:40p.m., police responded to a call of a disturbance in Mangilao. Police met with Vicente C. Cruz who explained that his son CHRIS CRUZ ("Defendant") has been drinking and refused to come into the home. Police responded to this residence three times on October 9, 2013. On the third visit, police interviewed Celino Chiro who stated that Defendant swung at him but missed. Chiro explained that he knew Defendant was drunk and did not mean to attack him. Police attempted to speak with Defendant and he took off running and disregarded police instructions to comply. Police were forced to pursue Defendant on foot and secure him in restraints.

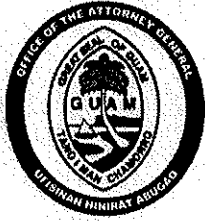
Based on the forgoing, there is probable cause to charge CHRIS CRUZ with one count of RESISTING ARREST (as a Misdemeanor) in violation of Title 9 G.C.A. § 55.35; and with one count of DISORDERLY CONDUCT (as a Petty Misdemeanor) in violation of Title 9 G.C.A. § 61.15(a)(1), (b) and (c).



DECLARATION

COMES NOW, SEAN BROWN, a duly appointed Assistant Attorney General, and aver, upon information and belief, that the foregoing is true.

I have reviewed Guam Police Report Nos. 13-28166 and 13-28131 submitted by GPD Officer E. C. Quintanilla which sets forth that the following events occurred on Guam.

On or about October 4, 2013, at about 2:00a.m., police investigated a disturbance in Tumon. Police met with Alicia Ann Aguon ("Victim") who stated that her boyfriend PEDRO FERRETIZ JR. ("Defendant") assaulted her earlier in the morning. Victim explained that she was dancing with a male friend at Blue Lagoon when Defendant arrived and learned of her dancing with another man. Defendant was agitated and asked Victim if he could buy her a drink but Victim refused. Defendant became more angry and strangled the Victim while pushing her to the back of the bar. Defendant stated "Bitch, why don't you want to drink with me." Defendant placed the Victim into a headlock and walked her out of the bar. Victim explained that Defendant again strangled her, but this time she almost fainted and could not breathe. Victim stated that she feared for her life. As the two were walking down the street towards the G Spot, Victim took a chance to escape and ran into the middle of the road. Victim explained to police that no one stopped their vehicle to help and Defendant dragged her by her hair off the road. Victim stated that an African-American male named Josh then approached the two and asked if everything was okay. Defendant then grabbed Victim's purse and ran away. Police observed Victim to sustain redness to her neck and scratches on her feet and legs.

Defendant was observed driving Victim's vehicle past the Tumon Precinct. Victim told police that she did not give Defendant permission to drive the vehicle but he must have used the keys in the purse he stole from her.

Based on the forgoing, there is probable cause to charge PEDRO FERRETIZ JR. with one count of FAMILY VIOLENCE (as a Third Degree Felony) in violation of Title 9 G.C.A. §§ 30.10(a)(1) and 30.20(a); and with one count of UNAUTHORIZED USE OF A MOTOR VEHICLE (as a Misdemeanor) in violation of Title 9 G. C. A. § 43.65(a).

DECLARATION

I, Gerald L. Henderson, a duly appointed Assistant Attorney General, aver upon information and belief that the following is accurate. I have reviewed synopsis prepared by Detective Keane Pangelinan. A review of said reports has revealed the following:

During the evening hours of October 4, 2013, HPC responded to a robbery in progress, at the Route 8 Mini Mart in Maite. Upon the arrival of GPD personnel, they were informed the male suspect had already fled the location. Officer Gallo then met with Dizon and the cashier, namely Angelita M. Ayangco, while the other GPD personnel made a check of the surrounding areas.

While Officer Gallo interviewed Dizon, Dizon informed Officer Gallo that on October 4, 2013, at about 7:30PM, as she was stocking drinks at the back of the establishment, she heard the sound of a male's voice, demanding the cashier, Ayangco, to open the register. Upon hearing the demands of the male individual towards Ayangco, Dizon informed Officer Gallo that she knew the establishment was being robbed to which she quickly concealed herself and ran up the second floor of the store to call 911, utilizing her cellular phone.

Officer Gallo interviewed Ayangco, who stated that while she was behind the cash register counter, talking to a male customer wearing a yellow colored t-shirt, a male individual described as being possibly local, about 5'7" in height, slim build, dark complexion, with short black hair and big round eyes, entered the establishment holding a small silver handgun. Ayangco indicated that she noticed the male suspect to have a brown colored shirt, over the lower portion of his face as he instructed her to open the cash register.

Ayangco stated that she thought the male suspect was joking, until the male suspect fired a shot with the handgun and yelled out for her again to open the cash register. After the male suspect fired the handgun, she knew the male individual was serious and was so scared that she had a hard time opening the cash register. After Ayangco finally managed to open the cash register, the male individual reached into the cash register and grabbed the money. The male suspect then ran out of the establishment, towards the roadway.

Ayangco stated that shortly after the male suspect exited the establishment, another male individual entered the store, whom was a customer, while the male individual wearing the yellow shirt that she was talking to prior to the robbery, also exited the establishment. The male customer who entered the store after the robbery and the male individual wearing the yellow shirt had left the area prior to police arrival, so an interview of them was not conducted.

On October 7, 2013, Detective John P.G. Lizama viewed the surveillance footage obtained from the Route 8 Mini Mart in Barrigada in which Detective Lizama noted the suspect was clad in a black colored hooded jacket, blue jean pants, white colored t-shirt, white gloves with red colored palms and armed with a silver colored handgun.

On October 7, 2013, at about 8:27A.M., U.S. Marshals Marc Patricio contacted Detective John P.G. Lizama and indicated that he viewed the surveillance footage of the Robbery that occurred at Route 8 Mini Mart in Barrigada via the Guam KUAM website and noticed the male individual clad in the yellow shirt to be one of his clients. Marshal Patricio identified the individual as Jerome C. Cruz and indicated that Cruz was currently in custody due to an outstanding warrant of arrest.

On October 7, 2013, Cruz was interviewed by Detective Keane C. Pangelinan to which Cruz stated that at about 7:30P.M., on October 4, 2013, he was at the Route 8 Mini Mart in Barrigada. Cruz was standing nearby the cashier counter when a male individual described as a male, possibly local, fair complexion, with a black colored t-shirt placed over his head, which partially obscured his face. Cruz stated that although his facial area was covered, the suspect's eyes, nose and mouth area was visible. Cruz stated that the suspect starred at him for a brief moment and then turned to the female cashier and pointed the firearm as he demanded for the establishment's money. Cruz stated that the individual subsequently discharged the firearm and was able to take money from the cash register. The individual then exited the establishment and fled on foot toward an unknown direction.

On October 8, 2013, Francis San Nicolas was interviewed by Detective Sang Q. To. San Nicolas stated that during the evening hours October 7, 2013, while at his Auntie Maria Untalan's residence in the Agana Heights village, he viewed the surveillance footage of the Robbery that occurred at the Route 8 Mini Mart in Barrigada. San Nicolas indicated that he accessed and viewed the footage utilizing a computer via internet website www.KUAM.com and identified the suspect as his friend namely Anthony Leon Guerrero Campos. San Nicolas indicated that he has known Campos since they both attended high school at the George Washington High School in Mangilao.

On October 8, 2013, Detective John P.G. Lizama prepared a photographic line up including a photograph of Campos. Detective Sang Q. To presented the photographic line up to Ayangco and Cruz to which both positively identified Campos as the suspect who robbed the Route 8 Mini Mart in Barrigada.

On October 8, 2013, Detective Sang Q. To interviewed Jesus Campos who indicated that he is the uncle of Campos. Jesus Campos viewed a photographic print out of the surveillance footage where Jesus Campos positively identified the individual in the photograph as his nephew Campos. Jesus Campos indicated that Campos was arrested and incarcerated in the island of Saipan for armed robbery where the use of machete was utilized. Jesus Campos then identified the residential address of Campos as #D1 Taitano Apartments, Tuba Street in Mongmong. Jesus Campos indicated that Campos resided at the apartment with his girlfriend who Jesus Campos identified as Rosalyne Aldan.

On October 8, 2013, Detective Keane C. Pangelinan conducted verification at the Taitano Apartments Management Office in Mangilao. Marie Warner verified that unit # D1 Taitano Apartments located along Tuba Street in Mongmong was being leased out to a female individual identified as Rosalyne Aldan.

On October 9, 2013, SWAT and CID personnel executed a Search Warrant at house Unit#: D1 Taitano Apartments in Mangilao. Anthony L.G. Campos was apprehended and brought into GPD CIS Office in Tiyan for questioning. Campos denied any and all involvement with the Robbery that occurred at Route 8 Mini Mart however, stated that he had knowledge of the individual who robbed the establishment. Campos was subsequently arrested relative to this Robbery investigation.

Based on the foregoing there is probable cause to charge **Defendant Anthony L.G. Campos with Second Degree Robbery** (As a Second Degree Felony), in violation of 9 G.C.A. §§40.20(a) (3) and (b) & **Deadly Weapon Used in Felony** 9 G.C.A. §80.37.
