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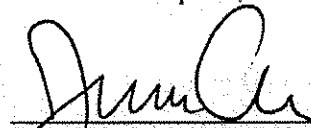

COMES NOW, James C. Collins, a duly appointed Assistant Attorney General, and aver, upon information and belief, that the foregoing is true.

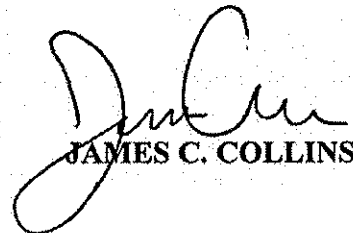
I have reviewed Guam Police Report No. 13-37189 submitted by GPD Officer A.J. Demapan which sets forth the following events occurred on Guam.

On or about December 28, 2013 at 03:40 A.M., while on patrol in Maite, Officers observed a vehicle execute a right turn onto the road they were driving on, nearly colliding with the police vehicle. The vehicle did not have its headlights on. The vehicle was observed straddling lane dividers. A traffic stop was conducted, and an odor of intoxicants was observed emanating from the interior of the vehicle. The operator of the vehicle, later identified as DEISON WES ADINIWIN, was observed to have blood-shot and watery eyes and a flushed face. ADINIWIN indicated that he had consumed alcohol. In the midst of performing the Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, ADINIWIN indicated he needed to urinate, removed his penis from his pants, and began urinating. The tests were discontinued. ADINIWIN was arrested, and refused to participate in any scientific testing.

Based on the foregoing, there is probable cause to charge DEISON WES ADINIWIN with DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL (As a Misdemeanor), in violation of Title 16 G.C.A. § 18102 (a), and with RECKLESS DRIVING (As a Petty Misdemeanor), in violation of Title 16 G.C.A. § 9107 (a).

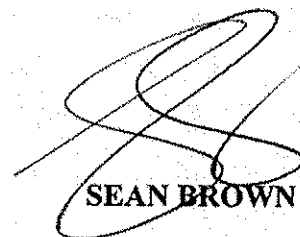
I have reviewed Guam Police Report Nos. 13-37258 submitted by GPD Officer P. J. Santos which set forth that the following events occurred on Guam.

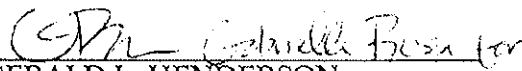

On 12/28/13, 2015, Officer responded to a auto-pedestrian accident at the Circle K in Piti. Officer interviewed Rachel Simiron. Simiron stated she was walking with her family when a black truck pulling out of the Circle K Gas Station (Piti) struck her son, E.C. (DOB 1/2/11)(YOA 2). The truck then drove away northbound on Route 1. E.C. appeared to be alert and responsive but had scratches on his forehead. The child was transported to GMH.

The security footage from the Circle K was reviewed and the recording showed a chld being struck by a vehicle described as a Black Chevrolet Silverado possible a 2010 – 2013 model.

A vehicle matching the description was located in University Gardens in Mangilao on 12/29/13 at 0214 hrs. **Nicole J. Cruz** met with police and reported that approximately 12/28/13 at 8:00 p.m. she was at the Circle K in Piti when her vehicle was attacked by a group of Micronesians.

Based on the foregoing there is probable cause to charge **DEFENDANT Nicole J. Cruz** (7/14/92) with **Leaving Scene of an Accident with Injuries** (As a Felony) in violation of 16 G.C.A. §3501(a).

I, **CHRISTINE SANTOS TENORIO**, a duly appointed Assistant Attorney General, aver upon information and belief that the following declaration is true. I have reviewed Guam Police Report 13-36684 submitted by Officer D.M. Calvo (#685), which revealed the following occurred in Guam:

On or about December 23, 2013, at approximately 12:10 a.m., officers of the Guam Police Department responded to a "bad checks" complaint at Guam Construction Association Trades Academy in Harmon. Officers met with complainant **RHEA DOMINGO**, the accountant of Guam Construction Association Trades Academy. **DOMINGO** stated that she discovered that seven checks from the company's Bank of Guam account were stolen and cashed. **DOMINGO** indicated that research revealed that the checks were cashed payable to "Rodney Aguero." **DOMINGO** stated that **RODNEY CAMACHO AGUERO** is the husband of another employee who works at Guam Construction Association Trades Academy. **DOMINGO** told police that she always leaves the door to her office open, and **DOMINGO** noticed that her desk drawers appear to have been tampered with.

**DOMINGO** provided police with photo copies of the seven Bank of Guam checks that were cashed, including check #3342 in the amount of \$740.00, #3353 in the amount of \$910.00, #3360 in the amount of \$780.00, #3389 in the amount of \$830.00, #3390 in the amount of \$760.00, #3391 in the amount of \$980.00, and #3392 in the amount of \$780.00. The total value of the seven checks is \$5,780.00. **DOMINGO** stated that a total of eighteen checks were missing from her desk drawer. On December 24, 2013, at approximately 12:35 p.m., **DOMINGO** discovered that four other checks had cleared and three checks were in the process of clearing. **DOMINGO** discovered that the stolen checks are being cashed at Valencia Foreign Exchange by a male individual.

On December 29, 2013, **AGUERO** surrendered to police at the Hagatna Precinct Command. **AGUERO** admitted that on or about December 6, 2013, after midnight, **AGUERO** took his wife's work keys from her purse and proceeded to enter Guam Construction Association Trades Academy. **AGUERO** stated that he took a single company check, wrote his name on the check, and cashed it at the Bank of Guam Mangilao branch. **AGUERO** stated that he went back to the company approximately three more times and took approximately six checks each time. **AGUERO** admitted writing his name on the checks and cashing them in varying amounts from \$700.00 to \$1500.00.

Based on the foregoing, there is probable cause to charge **RODNEY CAMACHO AGUERO** with:

1. BURGLARY (as a Second Degree Felony) (with intent to commit theft), in violation of 9 G.C.A. §37.20(a) and 9 G.C.A. §37.209(b);
2. THEFT (as a Second Degree Felony), in violation of 9 G.C.A. §43.30 and 9 G.C.A. §43.20; and

3. FORGERY (as a Misdemeanor), in violation of 9 G.C.A. §46.10(a)(2).

I have reviewed Guam Police Report No. 13-37286 submitted by GPD Officer Ayuyu (#751) and others, which sets forth, that the following events occurred on Guam.

On December 29, 2013, police responded to a burglary complaint at Xuana Restaurant in Dededo. The owner of the restaurant stated that at approximately 4:00 a.m. that morning, she heard a loud banging noise at the restaurant door. When she awoke a few hours later, she discovered that the door to the restaurant had been broken open and approximately \$130.00 of beer and \$40.00 of US currency had been stolen from inside. Three male individuals were captured on surveillance video breaking into the restaurant. Less than an hour after the burglary was reported, police located the three males that were depicted in the surveillance video. They were identified as **TATE OSHIRO, A.K.A. TATEUS THOMAS** ("Oshiro"), **AMSON YOTARO** ("Yotaro"), and **B.T. (DOB: 7/5/1999)**. All three individuals had been drinking. The three were surrounded by empty bottles of beer that matched the description of the beer stolen from the restaurant. Yotaro admitted that they got the beer "from the restaurant."

Based on the foregoing, there is probable cause to charge **TATE OSHIRO A.K.A. TATEUS THOMAS** and **AMSON YOTARO** with **BURGLARY** (As a Second Degree Felony) in violation of Title 9 G. C. COMES NOW Jesse N. Nasis, a duly appointed Assistant Attorney General, who avers upon information and belief that the following is true. I have reviewed the reports related to Guam Police Department Case No. 2013-37245 submitted by Officers D.T. Pangelinan and A.M. Munier. The reports revealed that the following events occurred in Guam:

On or about December 28, 2013, around 10:10 p.m., Officer Pangelinan responded to a reported retail theft at Macy's Department Store in the Micronesia Mall, where he met with Store Loss Prevention Officer Lea G. Cardenas, who said that she saw a woman later identified as ARIEL A. KO walk into a fitting room with several articles of clothing and exit shortly after without the clothing. Cardenas checked the fitting room and saw only one item in the room. Cardenas again saw KO walk into another fitting room with other clothing and cell phone cases and exit shortly after without those items. Cardenas checked this other fitting room and saw that it was empty. Cardenas confronted KO after KO exited the store and KO admitted that she placed the items in her purse and had no intention of paying for them. Clothes and cell phone cases with an estimated total value of \$989.43 were recovered from KO.

Based on the foregoing, there is probable cause to charge ARIEL A. KO with RETAIL THEFT (as a 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree Felony), in violation of 9 GCA §§ 43.91(a) and 43.20(b).
