GUAM SUNSHINE LIONS CLUB CELEBRATES 20 YEARS OF SERVICE

(Hagatna, Guam – January 17, 2017) - The Guam Sunshine Lions Club will celebrate 20 years of bringing sunshine to the lives of the sick and the elderly in need, with an event highlighting the Club's two decade journey of service, at The Westin Resort Guam, on Saturday, January 21, 2017. The Sunshine Lions will be joined at this milestone celebration by representatives from their two twinning Lions clubs -- the Okayama Asahi Lions Club, LCI District 336-B from Okayama, Japan and the Iloilo City Executive Lions Club, LCI District 301-B from Iloilo City, Philippines, and other Guam Lions Clubs members, and invited guests.

Since the Club's chartering in 1997, its members have worked tirelessly to uphold the Lions Clubs International motto, "We Serve", through its participation in various activities and projects in the community. The Guam Sunshine Lions Club has been extremely active in fulfilling its own mission to help the sick and the elderly as well as in undertaking other community projects, such as cleaning and refurbishing school bus shelters, and participating in various environmental projects such as Matson's "Adahi I Tano - Taking Care of the Land", and the U.S. National Park Service Coastal Cleanup projects. The GSLC is the first Club to organize a Club Branch, the Guam Tano-ta Branch Club (within LCI District 204). A club branch enables a small group of people (at least 5, and less than 20, and chartering is not possible) to form a Lions Club and start making a difference in the community; and is the first Club, out of the 22 Clubs in the District 204, to join Guam Visitors Bureau's "Håfa Adai Pledge" project whereby the Club stands committed to promoting and perpetuating Guam's cultural identity.

The Guam Sunshine Lions Club visits the sick and the elderly in their homes, in the hospitals, or the nursing facilities, and provides comfort and moral support with gifts of flowers, fruit baskets, or personal hygiene and nutritional supplies. It also provides monetary assistance to patients to help defray the costs of their medical treatment on or off-island.
